Investing in the specialist workforce for children and young people

We're writing to you as a broad coalition of over 110 charities, royal colleges, professional bodies, professional associations, trade unions, parents and carers and others who want the very best for child and young people - including those with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND).

Firstly, we'd like to congratulate you both on your new positions. We look forward to working with you and your ministers to ensure that all children and young people can achieve their potential, both at school and in life, including through ensuring that those with SEND can access the support they and their families depend on.

As we're sure you agree, ensuring children, young people and their families can access the specialist support they need from expert professionals is essential at every stage of their lives – from the early years, throughout their school lives, and, for those over 16, in colleges. For mainsteran educational settings to truly inclusive, teachers must have access to a broad range of specialist education, health and care professionals to ensure the best outcomes for children and young people, including those with SEND. Specialist estings must also be able to recruit the expert staff they need to meet the needs of their pupils.

We are getting in touch following the publication of the Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) and Alternative Provision (AP) Improvement Plan and your comments in the House of Commons on 7 March about the specialist workforce and the importance of specialist support.

We welcome the Government's commitment to work alongside children, young people and their families, and those who work across every part of the SEND system, to deliver improvements to the SEND and AP system. Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing as the Chief Executive of the Royal College of Speech and Language Therapists, the professional body for speech and language therapists in the United Kingdom, regarding an important matter related to the annual GP Patient Survey.

We appreciate the vital role that the GP Patient Survey plays in collecting insights about th healthcare experiences of individuals across the UK. However, we believe the current categorisations for "long-term conditions" are limiting the value and analysis of the findings and we'd like to propose the inclusion of a new category:

Speech, Language, and Communication Difficulties

It is very likely that the experience of people with speech, language and communication difficulties is impacted by those challenges.

For example, in 2023, the national charity STAMMA carried out some survey work exploring the experiences of people who stammer. They found that 43% of adults who stammer fails war official to sure the phone to book of 40 exponitement, despite the last that (in FeSK), booking by shown was the only explore of the Proctice.
